



## SHOTOKAN KARATE INTERNATIONAL AUSTRALIA

### COMPULSORY DRESS STANDARDS FOR REFEREEING AND JUDGING

The following dress standards are compulsory for Refereeing and Judging at the SKIA National Open Championships. Note that Karate Gi may be worn at the SKIA National Kyu Grade Championships, although Refereeing and Judging uniform is preferred.

Unless specified otherwise, the dress standards are the same for men and women.

#### **Refereeing and Judging Uniform**

1. No jewellery is to be worn, including (but not limited to) neck chains/necklaces, watches, rings and earrings.
2. Ties are to be the Official SKIA Tie only – not SKIF World Championship Ties or any other.
3. Shirts are to be plain white short sleeved “business” shirts.
4. Belt is to be black.
5. Trousers are to be grey. The grey is a light shade – not black, brown or dark slate.
6. Socks and Shoes are to be black. When Judging or Refereeing on the court, no shoes or socks will be worn (unless otherwise directed by the National Referees Council).
7. Blazer is not compulsory, but is preferred. The Blazer is to be Navy Blue – not Black. The Badge is either the SKIA Blazer Badge or the SKIF Yudansha-Kai badge.
